The Ax and Its Care PARTS OF AN AX WHAT IS the first tool for camp that a new butt or poll camper thinks of? An ax! But do you actually head shoulder need one? If you intend to go in for real lightweight camping, you'll find a way of getting face front along without the added weight of an ax, even a small one. However, if you plan middleweight camping, you'll want a hand ax, and if you expect to do woodland camping, you may decide handle heel to take a three-quarter ax, or possibly even a or felling ax.
