



## Behaviors of Successful Patrol Leaders

A committed Patrol Leader displays the following leadership traits in their behavior when working with a Patrol:

1. *Listening:*  
To listen to the ideas the Patrol and use their ideas to help get and develop new ideas to better our Patrol
2. *Questioning:*  
To ask questions in order to help the Patrol figure out what to do and to extend their thinking.
3. *Persuading:*  
To exchange ideas, explain ideas and openly discuss ideas with Patrol
4. *Respecting:*  
To respect the opinions of the members of the Patrol. To offer encouragement and support for new ideas and efforts.
5. *Helping:*  
To help the Patrol remember that *A Scout is Helpful*, and to be available to help whenever needed.
6. *Sharing:*  
To share with the Patrol. To make sure to share ideas and thinking. To share the work and any rewards and recognition.
7. *Participating:*  
To contribute to the Patrol assignment. To be actively involved with all work.
